

# PUBLIC OFFICIALS LIABILITY TRAINING

Boards/Commissions/Committees (B/C/C's)

The public's trust in governing bodies is enhanced when citizens are confident that personal business interests will not influence the decision-making of elected, appointed, or employed officials.



Public officials can face exposure in the following areas:

- Land use claims
- Administration of federal grants
- Granting or denying franchises, permits, or licenses
- Failure to protect the public trust, including failure to attend meetings, or to examine documents
- Use of inside information for personal benefit
- Keeping silent about improper conduct of fellow officials
- Denial of due process
- Harassment of a business or employees



Following these general guidelines will help you avoid potential problems as a public official:

- Think and act in terms of "We", not "I"
- As an individual member, you do not have the authority to work on your own; you must work as a collective body to accomplish the City's goals



#### **Quasi-Judicial Matters**

Be fair and impartial

Avoid conflicts of interest

If you have a conflict of interest, declare it and recuse yourself



#### **Quasi-Judicial Matters**

- Refrain from "ex parte" contacts
  - Consider only evidence and the law
  - When acting on legislative matters, "ex parte" contacts are allowed



# **Personal Liability**

- Don't act on personal motives
- Never retaliate against someone
- Avoid willful and wanton conduct



- Focus on legislative and quasi-judicial issues
- Delegate personnel issues to staff
- Stay within the scope of your authority



- Be knowledgeable about the process and procedures of municipal government and the specific responsibilities of your B/C/C
- Public statement should contain no promises to the public that may be construed to be binding on the B/C/C, staff or City Council
- Place the public welfare ahead of your own
